



Riding on the Newell Farm

WE OFTEN RIDE ON THE TRAILS THROUGH THE NEWELL FARM IN ORDER TO GET TO THE FINGER LAKES NATIONAL FOREST. THESE ARE BEAUTIFUL TRAILS AND GREATLY BENEFIT US IN CONDITIONING OUR HORSES, AS WELL AS GIVING US PLEASURE AND ENJOYMENT. IN ORDER TO CONTINUE APPRECIATING THEM, PLEASE FOLLOW THESE RULES AGREED UPON BETWEEN STACIA NEWELL AND ERIKA ECKSTROM.

- **ALWAYS WEAR A HELMET ON THE NEWELL FARM.**
- **WHEN THE GROUND IS WET AND THE TRAILS ARE SOFT, PLEASE KEEP IT TO A WALK. DURING DRY SEASONS, TROTting AND CANTERING IS FINE.**
- **DO NOT DO HILL REPEATS.**
To get more running into your ride, please use the roads in the National Forest
- **THERE ARE MANY REALLY GREEN YOUNGSTERS STARTING ON THE TRAIL THIS SPRING AT THE NEWELL FARM. PLEASE BE REALLY CAREFUL IF YOU ARE RIDING UP ON ANYONE OUT THERE.**
(most of the gray Arabians are seasoned. a horse of any other color is probably a newbie)
- **BOARDERS AND LEASERS ARE ALLOWED ON THE TRAILS.**
NO LESSON STUDENTS OR TRAIL RIDERS ARE ALLOWED ON THE NEWELL FARM TRAILS.
- **IF YOU RIDE THE TRAILS, PLEASE EXPECT TO BE PRESENT FOR ANNUAL TRAIL MAINTENANCE EVENTS.**
Tim and Stacia are the ones who keep the trails maintained along with all the other farm stuff that they are responsible. The better we treat the trails, the better they will stay. There can be very long pauses in between trail maintenance because of time limitations. Throughout the year there will be get togethers just to help with water bars and other bits of work that would keep us all pleased with the trail.
